Public Education Course Flyer: How To Read a Nautical Chart



How to Read a Nautical Chart is a three-hour seminar course that will help you unravel the mystery of charts. When navigating on *land* you use a map. It depicts the various thoroughfares, their directions and names. Major landmarks such as parks, lakes etc. would also be shown. By identifying with each of these landmarks and following printed routes, you would be able to reach a desired destination.

At sea there are no equivalent landmarks, and no routes. And, if you are far offshore, with no land mass over the horizon, everything looks the same. For navigating at sea, we use a chart, and we navigate by reference to what we can see, and often by what we cannot.

Nautical charts give us the "landmarks of the sea" – buoys, markers, shoreline features, water depth, bottom type, magnetic compass variation, and the latitude and longitude of these features. By knowing our latitude and longitude, we can locate our position anywhere on earth. Charts also warn us of dangerous areas, enabling us to determine safe passage – if we know how to read the chart and use the information we find there.

This course will provide the navigator with the knowledge to interpret a chart's contents to navigate safely to his or her destination and return to port. Text and training chart are included

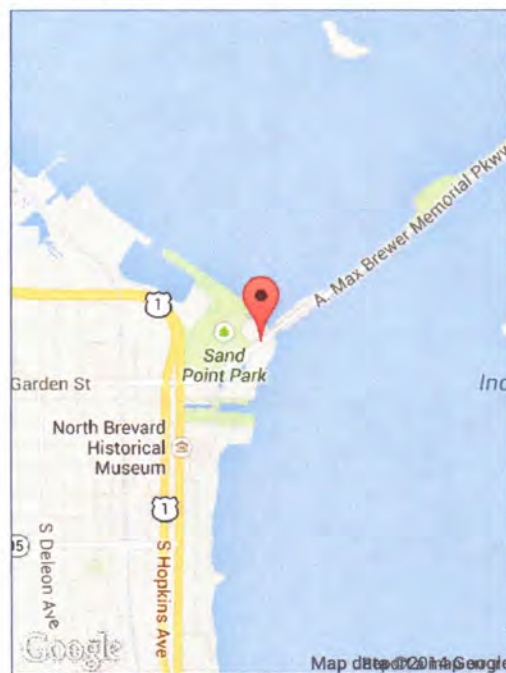
Topics include

- Know Your Paddlecraft - parts of a canoe and kayak; understanding paddlecraft characteristics such as basic types, hull shapes hull materials, lengths and widths and weights; selecting your paddle for both canoe and kayak.
- Before You Get Underway - knowing your paddlecraft's capacity and how to file a float plan; transporting your paddlecraft; conducting a predeparture check; dressing for a safe trip; loading gear in a canoe or kayak; storing paddle craft; the responsibilities when paddling with others.
- Operating Your Boat Safely - how to enter and exit a canoe or kayak safely; securing the paddlecraft and sharing the waterways with others; the U. S. Aids to Navigation System (ATONS); learning about local hazards on waterways.
- The Legal Requirements of Boating -vessel registration, hull identification numbers and who may operate a paddlecraft; unlawful operation of paddlecraft; Homeland Security restrictions; policies on alcohol and drugs. Life jackets; navigation lights; sound-producing devices and visual distress signals; protection of environment and what to do if in a boating accident. State-specific information may be added at the end of this chapter.
