“FINISHING THE HAT”

The title of Stephen Sondheim's book gives a clue: “Finishing The Hat—Collected Lyrics (1954-1981) with Attendant Comments, Principles, Heresies, Grudges, Whines and Anecdotes.” Sondheim's lyrics have become synonymous with musical theatre. Lyrics from “West Side Story” and “A Little Night Music,” along with many other famous songs by the author, are written and explained. What were the original lyrics? Why were the words changed? Which of the 500 or so versions of “Send in the Clowns” did Mr. Sondheim prefer---perhaps the one by Judy Collins, or by Frank Sinatra, or by Barbara Streisand? How were the actors chosen to sing in the Broadway plays? Photos plus stories provide a fascinating look at famous personalities, including Leonard Bernstein, Ethel Merman, Angela Lansbury, and more. If you don't know the stars by name, you probably know their music. You know many stars from television, but did you know some of these actors also sing?
