Paws For Independence partners students with visual impairments with professionally trained guide dogs. Our certified instructors provide students and their new guide dogs with 26 days of individualized instruction at our Palmetto, Florida campus or in-home placements - and lifetime follow up and support.

Students accepted into the program spend approximately four weeks bonding and training with their new guide dog under the watchful eye of our certified instructors at a student to trainer ratio of 3 to 1. A bond of love, trust and devotion forms between the blind master and the dog as they become a team.



Quote from Robert Gladstone, Graduate "I now have companionship and eyes to guide me. I feel confident with my girlfriend in one hand and my dog Simba in the other".

We provide the guide dog, equipment, single-room lodging, all meals, outings, instruction and post-graduation support completely free of charge, thanks to the generosity of our important contributors.

The average working life of a guide dog is eight years, and the majority of our graduates obtain multiple guide dogs from Southeastern Guide Dogs.

The process of developing and serving a successful guide dog team takes an average of ten years (two years of training and eight years of post-graduation services) and approximately \$60,000.

Paws For Independence, like all programs at Southeastern Guide Dogs, receives no governmental funding. We rely solely on the generosity of people like you.

Rejected. With good intentions etched into every ounce of his puppy body, Finn still managed to start out on the wrong paw. He was dismissed from another assistance dog program due to a dental problem that kept him from doing some essential tasks—like plucking a dropped credit card off the floor.

But Finn's potential wasn't lost on us. Seeing what every parent sees in a kid's crooked smile—which we fixed with canine orthodontia—Finn came to Leader Dog while still wet behind his floppy ears.

As most of our dogs do, Finn spent his first year with a family of devoted puppy raisers who focused on prepping him for his career. The McBride family had only a year to love the furry little puppy, and to be loved unreservedly and enthusiastically in return. A year to socialize Finn with people and animals, to teach basic obedience, to attend after-school games and enjoy weekend trips to the cabin. Always hovering on the horizon was the knowledge that Finn would not be theirs forever.

The five McBrides witnessed in Finn the characteristics that would eventually make him good at his job. "He is adventurous and friendly," Finn's human mom Janet remembers. "A quick dash to the grocery store turned into an hour-long event because everyone had to meet him." Finn proved himself to be fearless and sportsmanlike as he learned that soccer balls on the field weren't for him. "My favorite part," says Finn's human brother Andrew "was coming home. He'd be there wagging that tail like a flag."

Janet knew that Finn's real potential outweighs how much her family will miss him. "He's going on to bigger and better things," she states confidently. And he is. Finn moved into the training program, and a more disciplined lifestyle. Instructor Linda Fisher trained Finn, and says that guide work is his true calling. "He wants to be out with people, conquering the world," she says.

Over 70 years of respecting people and dogs, these are our values. We believe everyone deserves the opportunity for success, a second chance and the precious gifts of freedom and mobility. 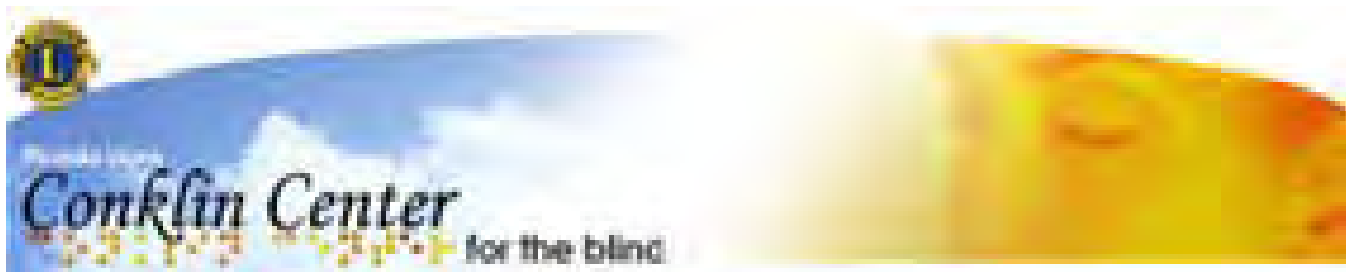

Multiple District 35 is comprised of seven (7) Districts.

District 35-F • District 35-L • District 35-O • District 35-R

District 35-I • District 35-D • District 35-A

District 35-F begins at Florida's western border and extends across the northern panhandle. It has 39 Lions Clubs, 3 Leo Clubs, 2 Lioness Clubs, and 2 Lions Auxiliary Clubs located in it's 20 counties.

District 35-L includes the following counties: Alachua, Baker, Bradford, Clay, Duval, Gilchrist, LaFayette, Levy, Marion, Nassau, Putnam, St Johns, Taylor and Union.

District 35-O includes the following counties: Flagler, Lake, Orange, Osceola, Seminole, Sumter, Volusia and Polk County North of State Road 60.

District 35-R includes the following counties: Citrus, Hernando, Hillsborough, Pasco and Pinellas.

District 35-I includes the following counties: Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Glades, Hardee, Hendry, Highlands, Lee, Manatee, Okeechobee, Sarasota and Polk County South of Highway 60.

District 35-D includes the following counties: Brevard, Broward (North from the Dania Cut-Off Canal and the South New River Canal), Indian River, Martin, Palm Beach, St Lucie and the Bahama Islands.

District 35-A includes the following counties: Broward (South from the Dania Cut-Off Canal and the South New River Canal), Miami-Dade and Monroe.

Effective July 2, 2010 Multiple District-35 will re-district into four (4) Districts and shall be designated as "District 35-L", "District 35-I", "District 35-O" and "District 35-N".

District L will consist of the following counties: Alachua, Baker, Bay, Bradford, Calhoun, Clay, Columbia, Dixie, Duval, Escambia, Franklin, Gadsen, Gilchrist, Gulf, Hamilton, Holmes, Jackson, Jefferson, Lafayette, Leon, Liberty, Madison, Marion, Nassau, Okaloosa, Putman, Santa Rosa, St. Johns, Suwannee, Taylor, Union, Wakulla, Walton and Washington.

District I will consist of the following counties: Charlotte, Collier, DeSoto, Hardee, Highlands, Hillsborough, Lee, Manatee, Pasco, Pinellas, Polk (south of Highway 60) and Sarasota.

District O will consist of the following counties: Brevard, Citrus, Flagler, Hernando, Lake, Levy, Orange, Osceola, Polk (North of Highway 60), Seminole, Sumter and Volusia.

District N will consist of the following counties: Broward, Glades, Hendry, Indian River, Martin, Miami-Dade, Monroe, Okeechobee, Palm Beach, St. Lucie and the country of Bahama.

Lions and Hearing Awareness ~ How Can Lions Help

Lions can take an active role in promoting hearing loss prevention and assisting those who are deaf or hearing impaired. Here are some ways Lions can help.

Chairpersons

Lion clubs appoint one member to serve as their Hearing and Speech Action and Work with the Deaf chairperson. On the district level, a Lion is appointed as District Hearing and Speech Action and Work with the Deaf chairperson.

Both club and district-level chairpersons develop service projects which aid persons who are deaf or hard of hearing. Before implementing a service project, it is suggested that Lions contact local government and private agencies (including Lions hearing foundations) for the deaf or hard of hearing. This can eliminate the duplication of services. In addition, local agencies that have ongoing projects may be in need of additional assistance.

Hearing Awareness

Lions can help educate the public about hearing impairments and prevention of hearing loss:

- * Participate in health fairs and distribute information about deafness, hearing impairment and hearing loss prevention.
- * Download the Lions brochure, Understanding hearing impairments (IAD-08). To order copies for distribution, send an e-mail to programs@lionsclubs.org.
- * Compile a list of local resources including the names of healthcare professionals for diagnosing hearing loss; the names of vendors for the purchase of new or used hearing devices; and vocational training programs.
- * Create public awareness of noise levels and support noise abatement efforts.
- * Donate books and other educational materials about deafness and hearing impairment to the local library.
- * Determine the availability of a Lions district or multiple district hearing van and organize a hearing screening.
- * Support recreational camps for children and adults who are deaf or hearing impaired. Contact Health and Children's Services Department for a Lions camp list.
- * Get involved in the Lions Hearing Aid Recycling Program.

Examples of Lions Hearing Projects

- * The Lions of Multiple District 105 (British Isles and Ireland), created the "Deaf Aware" program to promote and encourage better communication with the hearing impaired. The Lions also distribute safety door hangers for hotels and guest houses, which are designed to assist those with disabilities in an emergency.
- * In India, the Lions of District 324-D3 produced pamphlets in regional languages explaining deafness, possible treatments, and job training opportunities.
- * The Lions of District 35 (Florida, USA) worked with government officials for the passage of a new state law requiring hearing screenings for newborn babies.
- * Lions in Missouri, USA, sponsored billboards that informed the public about hearing and deafness.
- * In Alberta, Canada, the hearing chairman for Lions District 37-E, used puppets, coloring books, audiotapes, and videotapes to teach children about hearing loss.
- * Lions provide support to Hearing Ear Dog Schools.

Lions Clubs Record Second Straight Membership Increase

OAK BROOK, IL, USA, September 18, 2009 – At a time when many membership organizations are seeing a decline in members, Lions Clubs International, the world's largest service club organization, has recorded two straight years of membership increase. This is its first consecutive years of membership increase since the 1990s.

"Our membership around the world has increased by nearly 30,000 members in the past two years," says Eberhard J. Wirfs, president of Lions Clubs International. Lions Clubs International is the only service club with a growing worldwide membership.

Lions membership is off to a Quick Start in the new fiscal year that began in July 2009. Lions established three times as many new clubs in July and August as they did during the same time last year. "Our membership increase is being driven by an increase in women and family members," says Wirfs. "We are growing because we are showing how Lions clubs are making a difference – how we work in local communities, nationally and internationally on behalf of others."

Lions clubs are reaching out in new ways and to new and younger members. Several years ago they began organizing family clubs that encourage parents and children and other family members to volunteer together. These clubs are designed to fit into the schedule of busy families. Lions have also organized many specialty clubs such as cyber clubs that meet online and get together only to do service projects and ethnic or other clubs that serve the interests and needs of groups within communities.

Lions have held membership extension workshops and developed regional programs in areas such as Eastern Europe and Africa that are showing progress in recruiting younger members. Membership is increasing rapidly in countries such as India, where 70 percent of the population is under the age of 40. In China, 20 new clubs were formed in July and August of this year.

Lions Clubs International has more than 1.32 million members in 205 countries and geographic areas. In addition to its efforts toward conquering blindness, the organization has made a strong commitment to community service and helping youth throughout the world.

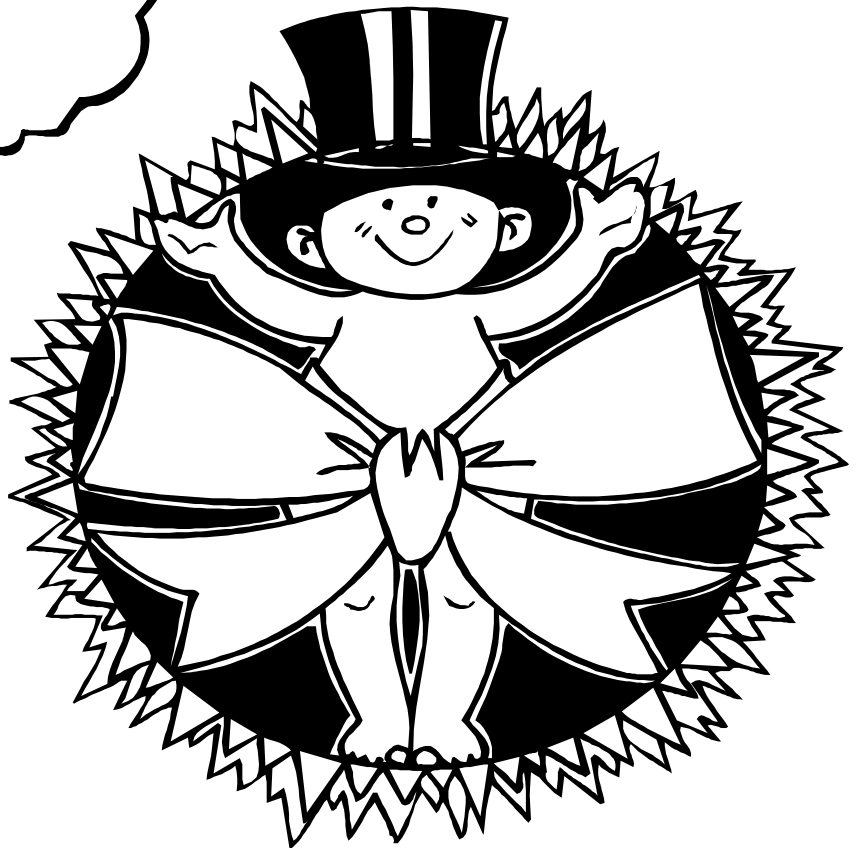
