

How do I become a Foster Parent?

Being a foster parent is a very rewarding experience. You will be caring for children who have been abused or neglected and serving as a role model for the biological families who are working to be reunified with their children. This is the ultimate public trust.

Important Steps:

- Attend an orientation
- Complete 30 hours of foster parent training
- Participate in child abuse and criminal background check
- Participate in an in-depth home inspection and home study

You may be eligible for foster parenting if you are:

- At least 21 years old
- Married or single
- Renting or owning
- Financially stable
- Committed to loving and nurturing a child in your home
- Willing to work in partnership with everyone involved in the child's life to meet the child's needs
- Dedicated to help a child reunify with their biological family
- Committed to attending required training sessions
- Able to physically accommodate children in your home
