Offices are located in Titusville and Rockledge. The Coalition has acquired over 125 housing units throughout the county for our clients. Housing currently consists of transitional units for families and individuals, permanent units for disabled persons, and for homeless veteran and permanently disabled veterans. Transitional housing services are provided for up to two years and case management and other support services are provided in order for clients to reach a goal of acquiring permanent housing.
