

Sams House is one of eight of the Museums of Brevard where the 3rd Annual Holiday Tour of Historic Homes will take place on three weekends in December. A limited number of tickets priced at \$70 went on sale in November through www.eventbrite.com.

The tour showcases the architecture styles of the late 19th century to the mid-20th century in Florida.

Other Holiday Tour locations include: The Moore Center, and Pritchard House, Titusville; Field Manor, Merritt Island; Cape Canaveral Lighthouse; Lawndale, Rockledge; and Rossetter House and Green Gables, Melbourne.

EEL 20-Year Bond Approved

The Environmentally Endangered Land and Water Areas Bond Referendum which was placed on the November 8 ballot for Brevard voters was approved with 175,740 votes equalling 70.43% of votes cast. Thank you to all who supported this Environmentally Endangered Lands Program (EEL) bond which will continue to fund the EEL Program for another 20 years.

Environmental naturalists. taught them about how early-day pioneers lived including hanging clothes with wooden clothes pins on a line to dry. She also escorted them on a guided hike through Nature Center trails where they learned how the pioneers used the local plants and animals in order to survive. Everyone is excited that field trips have resumed again this year at the Sams House Nature Center.



Garnet Trail Receives Facelift

The Garnet Trail, which is accessable off of the educational loop at Sams House is 1.37 miles long and extends from the Sams House area to the Pine Island Conservation Area parking area off of Pine Island Road. Recent Outreach Efforts by PIPS

15,000 Redfish Released at Thousand Islands

As part of a habitat restoration effort, 15,000 redfish fingerlings were released into the Banana River near the south Thousand Islands in Cocoa Beach by the Coastal Conservation Association (CCA) of Florida in early November. Local anglers caught redfish in the Indian River Lagoon that were bred for this effort at Duke Energy's Crystal River Mariculture Center in Citrus County. The Thousand Islands are part of the Environmentally Endangered Lands Program managed by David DeMeyer, EEL Land Manager, Central Region which includes the Sams House and Pine Island Conservation Area. More redfish releases are planned by the CCA in south Florida locations.
