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2010-11 Spoil Island Enhancement Projects

BC47



Last season, BC47 was the site of substantial enhancement efforts. Through an adoption partnership with Dr. Irlandi of Florida Institute of Technology, students removed exotics, added native plants, and erected an educational kiosk. This season our goal is to continue to remove exotics to create more recreation space, as well as monitor the newly planted natives.

IR36



IR36 was the main project site two years ago. The island underwent a complete exotic removal, trail blazing, and native planting. This season, we will continue to maintain trails, remove resprouting exotic plant, and monitor the planted natives.

SL3



Over the past several months, SL3 has undergone large scale enhancement efforts. Contractors have removed all the exotics from the island and replanted the areas with native vegetation. Campsites, which were previously overgrown with exotics and in disrepair, will be refurbished with trails connecting each site. Although major construction is almost finished, the island will still require several months of maintenance, supplemental watering of the newly added plants, and diligent removal of any exotics that resprout.
