Circles of Care, Inc. has been a leader in our community in Behavioral/Mental Health Services since 1963.

We have consistently been in the forefront of our field, developing and administering programs to meet the varying needs and problems encountered by Brevard County Residents.

Substance Abuse Prevention Services

The Substance Abuse Prevention Services are those involving strategies that preclude, forestall, or impede the development of substance abuse and mental health problems, and include increasing public awareness through information, education, and alternative-focused activities.

Information dissemination is a strategy intended to increase awareness and knowledge of the risks of substance abuse and available prevention services. Education is a strategy intended to improve skills and to reduce negative behavior and improve responsible behavior. The intent of alternative-focused activities is to provide constructive activities that exclude substance abuse and reduce anti-social behavior.

It is our intent to provide these services at **Volunteers of America (VOA)** through a group format twice a week. There will be groups held on Tuesday and Thursdays each week. One will be at 10:00 a.m. and the second group will be conducted at 2:00 p.m. These are open groups and residents of **VOA** as well as the general community are welcomed to attend. Individuals, couples and families are welcome. There is no child care provided so parents are responsible to schedule appropriate child care while attending the groups. They will be ongoing groups and will meet each week unless of a particular holiday.

IMPOWER: CENTRAL FLORIDA CARES PROGRAM
Providing FREE Mental Health Services through Telehealth



Through a new partnership with Central Florida Cares Health System, IMPOWER is now offering no cost mental health services in Brevard, Orange, Osceola, and Seminole Counties to both children and adults through Telehealth.

Eligibility: To qualify for no cost services individuals must be uninsured and meet the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) guidelines for poverty.

What is Telehealth?
Telehealth is a way to provide services online through a secure, HIPPA compliant, private, and live video connection. Appointments can be secured on a smartphone, tablet, or computer that has video conference capabilities.

Benefits of Telehealth

- Easier to schedule/more available appointments
- Decreases wait times
- Reduces travel time and costs
- Decreases missed school or work
- Increases the number of practitioners you can choose
- Increases privacy
- Decreases stigma

Clinic & Mental Health Care Services
Provided by Highly Qualified Therapists and Physicians

Outpatient Treatment & Counseling: treatment for children, adolescents, adults and families who are experiencing mental health, substance abuse or behavioral health problems.

Psychiatric Clinics & Medication Management: Our Psychiatric Team offers evaluation and medication management.

Central Florida CARES Case Management: Case Management assists and provides support to clients with services that are essential to meeting basic human needs and monitors overall service delivery. Provides coordination and linkage to needed services for clients that are uninsured and meet the TANF poverty guidelines.
